Indication

GIAPREZA[™] (angiotensin II) increases blood pressure in adults with septic or other distributive shock.

Contraindications

None.

Warnings and Precautions

The safety of GIAPREZA was evaluated in 321 adults with septic or other distributive shock in the randomized, double-blind, placebo-controlled ATHOS-3 study. There was a higher incidence of arterial and venous thrombotic and thromboembolic events in patients who received GIAPREZA compared to placebo treated patients in the ATHOS-3 study [13% (21/163 patients) vs. 5% (8/158 patients)]. The major imbalance was in deep

venous thromboses. Use concurrent venous thromboembolism prophylaxis.

Adverse Reactions

The most common adverse reactions reported in greater than 10% of GIAPREZA-treated patients were thromboembolic events. Adverse reactions occurring in \geq 4% of patients treated with GIAPREZA and \geq 1.5% more often than placebo-treated patients in the ATHOS-3 study were thromboembolic events (including deep vein thrombosis), thrombocytopenia, tachycardia, fungal infection, delirium, acidosis, hyperglycemia, and peripheral ischemia.

Drug Interactions

Angiotensin converting enzyme inhibitors may increase response to GIAPREZA.



istributive shock is associated with high mortality in critically ill patients, especially when there is no response to fluids and catecholamines (refractory shock). Early identification and prompt restoration of organ perfusion and increased blood pressure is crucial in these refractory cases. A newly approved agent, such as angiotensin II, that treats refractory distributive shock, while potentially sparing some of the adverse effects of high-dose catecholamines, may improve outcomes of this challenging condition. Clinicians who are involved in the care of critically ill patients need education on how to incorporate new treatment options in their practices in order to optimize therapy and improve patient outcomes.



Ground Level Lobby








